Unsung volunteers honoured at NatWest OSCAs 2017

The heroes of the grassroots game were recognised for their efforts at the 15th NatWest OSCAs at Lord's yesterday (9 October).

Volunteers travelled from far and wide to Lord's for a day recognising the hard work and dedication of all of those who help make sure that club cricket continues to thrive.

Alison Mitchell in paying tribute and awarding the OSCAs at a packed nursery pavilion.

Megan Jones received the Young Volunteer of the Award OSCA for her work at Audley Cricket Club in Staffordshire passing on her love of the game to a new generation of female players.

Megan said: “I’m really chuffed to be here. I’ve never been to Lord’s before and I’m a bit star struck meeting the England players but I’m really happy.

“(Winning this award) makes you understand that people are recognising what I’m doing. At my club we are all volunteers and without those people, kids and young adults would not get the opportunity to play.”

Dave Cherry won the NatWest CricketForce OSCA on behalf of Denby Cricket Club in Derbyshire, one of the showcase clubs this year. He led a number of projects including turning the club’s scorebox into female changing rooms.

After picking up the award Dave said: “It something that we’ve done for number of years. We all come together and get things ready for the start of the new season. We had a lot of big jobs but were confident we could do them after the response we had from the members. Around 240 people turned up over the weekend and £20,000 worth of work was done at the cost of £2,500. It was a great community and club effort.

“It was brilliant to see the kids there, playing a game at the club and it was a fantastic weekend. It brought everybody together. You can’t put a figure to it.”

The Coach of the Year OSCA was awarded to Khushali Patel from the Harrow Alliance thanks to her work enabling girls and women’s cricket to go from strength to strength in Harrow.

Khushali said: “A couple of years ago we started up a girls’ cricket team in Harrow and in the region of 30-40 play now. Aside from the girls’ side, I do the All Stars project at the club. I make loads of new friends, learn lots and it’s just a lot of fun. You get a chance to do loads of different skills playing cricket, there’s so much variety.”

Talking about the awards, England ODI captain Eoin Morgan said: “Days like

these are absolutely priceless. It's a hugely special day for people being recognised for the work they've put in not only this year but their whole lives at their local club ground, it is absolutely phenomenal. Everyone here has a huge smile on their face."

Talking directly to volunteers he added, "You are a hugely significant part of the development of the game in this country. Pat yourself on the back for the work you are doing but please continue to do it. It's sometimes unrecognised but you play a huge role in people's lives. We play a fantastic game that develops characteristics that will help young people later on in life."
